Aled Gruffydd Jones is a Welsh cultural historian, editor and author. His main research fields are the history of nineteenth and early twentieth-century Welsh, English, European and American journalism, and the transcultural connections between religion, gender and identities in Wales and colonial India. More recently he has written on the politics of culture in Europe's age of austerity and the cultural impact of China on Western media and historiography. He has held the posts of Sir John Williams Professor of Welsh History and Senior Pro Vice-Chancellor at Aberystwyth University, Literary Director of the Royal Historical Society, Vice-President and later Chief Executive of the National Library of Wales and National Librarian of Wales. He has also taught at Northwest University, Xi'an, China, and Panteion University, Athens, Greece.
